1 Introduction & Agenda

- The Chair welcomed members introduced the agenda

2 Governance

- The Competition Law Reminder is included in the presentation slides as is customary.
- The Chair welcomed four new members to the group.

3 Operational update

- JM updated members on the Data Quality Metrics status report and enhancement updates, including the Q1 2026 accomplishments, Q2 progress and Q3/Q4 development roadmap. As of June 2026, the DTI registry contains 4,174 auxiliary tokens, 289 protocol tokens, 3,103 Equivalent Digital Token Groups and 338 DLIs, with zero disputes to date.
- DD updated members on the ANNA integration: from 25 July, DTIF will begin receiving data flows from NNAs on digital asset status and ledger, allowing DTIs to be allocated and fed back into ANNA's database, with the existing download-link feed to be retired once live.
- DTIF also noted feedback received on the need for issuer guidance on obtaining a DTI and confirmed it will produce a resource for members to share.

4 Implementation Guidance

- DTIF presented on DTI allocation to NFTs, noting that NFT distributed ledger was added as a normative data element in 2025 but omitted from the Annex A summary table. Members discussed the appropriate threshold for correcting such omissions without a full ISO revision. There was general support for DTIF proceeding to include NFT distributed ledger in the registry while, in parallel, raising the omission with ISO TC68 as part of the relevant ISO update process.
- DTIF presented its proposed certification service, intended to provide assurance that issuer documentation supports a DTI record. Members discussed scope, annual renewal, validation criteria, fee model and terminology for any lapsed status. DTIF will further develop the proposal based on member feedback and bring updated recommendations back to the group.
- Members provided feedback on the DTIF product development roadmap, including potential work on sandbox engagement, tokenised securities classification, crypto payments and Web3 data distribution. DTIF will follow up on relevant suggestions and continue developing the roadmap based on member feedback.

5 Regulatory and industry engagement

- DTIF updated members on recent UK cryptoasset regulatory publications, including the confirmed use of the DTI across key disclosure, transparency, record-keeping and safeguarding
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requirements. DTIF also noted recent and upcoming regulatory consultations, including the EU MiCA review and the UK Wholesale Digital Markets champion report, and will follow up on relevant engagement opportunities.

- DTIF invited members to flag relevant consultations or comments for upcoming submissions and provided an industry engagement update, including recent work with GDF, ISDA and Ownera on tokenised money market fund use cases, inclusion in GBBC's blockchain use cases handbook and recent GLEIF coverage on interoperable ISO identifiers. DTIF also noted upcoming engagement opportunities at relevant industry events.
